**Emitovanje je dvosmerni kanal, 2011 – danas, Darija Medić (Beograd)**  
**Transmitting is a two way channel, 2011- today, Darija Medić (Belgrade)**



**Emitovanje je dvosmerni kanal** je interaktivni rad, koji poredi internet, kao participativni medij sa jednosmernim modelom starih mas medija. Inspirisan idejom iz Bertold Brehtovog eseja “Radio kao aparat komunikacije”, u kom se zalaže da radio prenos treba da bude dvosmerni kanal, rad nudi da tekstualni sadržaj koji se kuca u browser biva uživo emitovan na FM radiju preko sintetizovanog softverskog glasa. Nudeći strategiju Reverse search engineering (search engine i reverse engineering), dobijamo mogućnost da pretraživač ili bilo koje tekstualno polje u browser-u koristimo kao subverzivnu stanicu za oglašavanje. Na taj način menjamo namenu komunikacije sa “pametnim” algoritmima koji svakodnevno beleže naše onlajn ponašanje i pronalaze upotrebno značenje unutar svakog tekstualnog sadržaja na internetu.

**Darija Medić** kroz upotrebu jezika, tehnologije i umetnosti istražuje područje korekcije/krađe/gradjenja identiteta i lavirinata savremenih tehnoloških praksi. Stvara u kontekstu oblikovanja javnog domena, društvenih praksi jezika, medija i medijske arheologije, filozofije tehnologije. Od 2012 pokreće Interkultivator, inicijativu koje se fokusira na decentralizaciju kulturne produkcije, roda i tehnologije. Trenutno kao Koordinatorica projekata digitalne umetnosti u DiploFoundation, radi na stvaranju veza između digitalne/kritičke medijske umetnosti i digitalnih politika.

**Transmitting is a two way channel** is an interactive piece, that puts into a relation the Internet as a participatory medium to a one directional model of communication transmission of old mass media. Inspired by Bertold Brecht's essay "The radio as an apparatus of communication" in which he argued for radio transmission to be a two way channel, the work offers a live FM transmission of textual content typed in the web browser via a text to speech synthesizer. Offering a strategy of Reverse search engineering (search engine and reverse engineering), we gain the possibility to use search engines or any other browser text field as a subversive broadcasting unit, consciously communicating with "smart algorithms" which find practical meaning in any textual form.
